To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS *Hugh Kelsey, of Morgan County, Missouri,*

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the **REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE** at *Fayette,* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Hugh Kelsey,*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for *the North East Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Thirty, in Township Forty-three, of Range Sixteen in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fayette, Missouri, containing forty acres.*

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Hugh Kelsey.*

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto the said *Hugh Kelsey*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Hugh Kelsey,*

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Millard Fillmore* **PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** have caused these Letters to be made **PATENT,** and the **SEAL** of the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** to be hereunto affixed.
